

Extra Donation Items

Often, groups ask what additional supplies they can bring to a mission site. Below is a list of items that would be helpful for your group to bring. You are not *required* to bring additional items. Please be aware that items you bring may not be used during the week of your group's mission trip.

When your Site Director contacts you to discuss trip details, please confirm specific quantities and find out which items are most needed at your site.
