

## View Webcast using VLC Player

If you are using a MAC and have installed Flip4Mac but are still having issues, we recommend that you try an alternate player that has been tested and found to work on the MACs with MacOS Lion (and most likely all MACS).

VLC is a versatile media player and is compatible both with Windows and MAC machines but we are recommending it for the MAC when other alternatives are not working.

### Install VLC Player

Download VLC by going to: <http://www.videolan.org/vlc/download-macosx.html> click on the 3rd option down on the website — 64 bits Intel Mac, 1.1.12. If you have a 32-bit or older machine you may need to choose one of the other downloads compatible with your machine.



After it downloads, click on it to open from the download area. It will ask you if you really want to open it... "yes" you do. A folder will open up with several files in it.

The orange striped cone is the VLC application. Drag the cone to your Applications folder for future use.

### Using VCL Player to play archived sermons

Open VLC by double-clicking on the orange cone from applications folder. An application should open that says VLC Media Player.

Go to the archived sermons on St. Luke's website at: <http://www.stlukesumc.com/worship/sermonarchives/>

For the sermon you want to watch, do the following:

- Right click (or two-finger click) on the "watch" hyperlink next to the sermon you want to watch.
- It should open a menu with "Copy Link" as the option at the top. Choose "Copy Link".
- Go to VLC. On its menu bar choose File>Advanced Open File
- A separate window will open....choose the "Network" menu bar from the top.

- In the field labeled "URL", paste the link you previously copied. (command V)
- Hit "Open"
- Go back to the VLC Media Player and hit play. It should begin playing the archived sermon.

### Using VCL Player to play live Webcast

Open VLC by double-clicking on the orange cone from applications folder. An application should open that says VLC Media Player.

On the menu bar choose File > Advanced Open File. A separate window will open. Choose the "Network" menu bar from the top.

- In the field labeled "URL", paste the link  
mms://live1.christianvideochannel.com/stlukesumc (note you can always get to this link by going to the St. Luke's website and getting to the page with the big 'watch' button on it for webcast. If you right click the button (instead of left clicking) you get some options and you can 'copy shortcut' or 'copy link' and then paste the URL in.
- Hit "Open"
- Go back to the VLC Media Player and hit play. It should begin playing the live Webcast
