

WAYS YOU CAN SERVE DURING COVID-19

Dear St.Luke's Family:

We are SO grateful for the ways in which your service and giving are helping to remind neighbors and families in need that the church is STILL OPEN. Over the last several days St.Luke's has been blessed with a matching grant up to \$50,000. This will allow is to provide up to \$100,000 in direct assistance to families struggling to afford food, childcare, utilities and other basic needs during this pandemic. You can make an impact NOW by giving here and selecting Benevolence or sending your donation to the church with the memo: Benevolence.

To date your generosity has generated over \$6,000 in giving which helped to fund a drive-through Food Pantry at St.Luke's for 80 Washington Township families this weekend.

Signed, Sealed, Delivered Mission Project: We'll be writing cards and letters to fellow St. Lukers residing in assisted living facilities or those who are homebound during this time. Want to spread some Love (and not germs?) ? Sign up to send a card or letter to a member once a week for the next 5 weeks. After you sign up we'll assign you your St.Luke's pen pal!

Help for the Homebound: Many St.Luke's members and neighbors are at high-risk for travel and leaving their homes to run errands like grocery store shopping and medical prescription pick up. Help us shift hope into high gear by shopping and delivering necessary items to congregation and community members in need. Sew in Love: There is a critical shortage of surgical masks for healthcare workers who are serving on the front lines of COVID-19. Board Games for Kids: Social distancing is hard on any family especially those who have limited space and financial resources. They have asked that volunteers provide this care in the hospital employee's home. If you are willing and able, please let us know!
