WEEK 3: NOVEMBER 6, 2022

READ Matthew 22:37-39 and Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Matthew 22:37-39 - Jesus replied "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind. This the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: You must love your neighbor as you love yourself."

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 - Israel, listen! Our God is the LORD! Only the LORD! Love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your being, and all your strength. These words that I am commanding you today must always be on your minds. Recite them to your children. Talk about them when you are sitting around your house and when you are out and about, when you are lying down and when you are getting up. Tie them on your hand as a sign. They should be on your forehead as a symbol. Write them on your house's doorframes and on your city's gates.

- We are asked to consider many reasons for loving God. What is the ultimate reason?
- Have you ever met a "Mr. Tony"? What happened? Reflections on your experience?
- Last check-in of this sermon series: how has it been to try to cultivate intimacy with God every day, serve someone else every day, and do something good for YOU each day? To what degree have these intentions made this sermon series relevant to your life?
