DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How do you typically respond to change?
- Reread this week's Scripture (Jeremiah 29:4-7). Jeremiah is speaking to people living in exile, trying to navigate a massive change in their reality. What would have been challenging about his message? Why do you think this message is important?
- A common saying is that "People don't fear change, they fear loss." How have you experienced the relationship between loss and change?
- One of Jeremiah's key messages is for the people to let themselves prosper in the place they find themselves. What could it look like for you to prosper in a place of change?

Jeremiah 29:4-7

This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5 "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce. 6 Marry and have sons and daughters; find wives for your sons and give your daughters into marriage, so they too may have sons and daughters. Increase in number there: do not decrease. 7 Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.
