Love When Things Aren't Clear

1 Corinthians 13:9-13

9 For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part, 10 but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. 11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. 12 For now we see only a reflection, as in a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. 13 And now faith, hope, and love remain, these three, and the greatest of these is love.

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Getting Started

- Pastor Rob said that we need other people to function as our mirrors- to help us see ourselves more clearly. Who are the mirrors in your life?

Sermon & Scripture Discussion:

Read this week's Scripture together, then discuss:

- Sometimes we struggle to see ourselves clearly and to see the people around us clearly as well. Why do you think we struggle with this?
- When have you had the opportunity to love someone in the midst of ambiguity or when there was a lack of clarity?
- Sometimes a lack of clarity leads to conflict, which necessitates reconciliation. What needs to happen in order for reconciliation to occur?
- In the Scripture, Paul says that faith, hope, and love are the essentials- and that love is the most important of the three. What do you make of this statement? What does it tell us about our Christian life?
